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#### **Ending the HIV Epidemic: A Plan for America**

**Diagnose** all people with HIV as early as possible.

 ${\bf Treat}\,$  people with HIV rapidly and effectively to reach sustained viral suppression.





**Prevent** new HIV transmissions by using proven interventions, including pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP) and syringe services programs (SSPs).

**Respond** quickly to potential HIV outbreaks to get needed prevention and treatment services to people who need them.





## **Ending the HIV Epidemic: a Plan for DC**

The Four Pillars +1

- Diagnose: *HIV Testing*
- Treat: *Rapid ART, U=U*

- Engage: Commitment, Wellness, Stigma, Equity

#### Vision

The epidemic has ended for all communities, resources are equitably available, and optimal health outcomes are attainable for everyone in the District of Columbia.

#### Mission

By providing prevention and treatment services that are safe to access, supported by the latest scientific evidence, and responsive to the wellness and needs of communities and individuals, we will end the HIV epidemic when:

- We have fewer than 130 new cases of HIV per year;
- People living with HIV can easily and safely maintain optimal integrated health and;
- We collectively acknowledge and aspire to address the impact of stigma and structural racism on sexual health and HIV outcomes.

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## **Clinical Care Coordination Services**

#### Purpose

Expand access to Ryan White HIV care and treatment

Increase awareness of HIV status Reduce the number of new HIV transmissions

Improve viral suppression rates



## **Areas of Focus**



People over 500% of FPL-No **income requirements** 



Status neutral



Private medical providers



**Returning Citizens** 



#### **Program Design**

Clinical Care Coordinators will be DC Health employees and deployed to community providers to increase their capacity to provide HIV care and social support services.

Provider sites will include private medical providers, hospitals and returning citizen/re-entry service providers.

The Clinical Care Coordinators will be monitored by HAHSTA, in conjunction with the on-site agency liaison.



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## Rapid ART workgroup

**Goal:** To reduce the time taken for an HIV positive person to start ART. Identify barriers among providers and consumers.

**Intervention:** Feedback sessions were held with providers and community-members. This workgroup is continuing to develop materials to promote and facilitate Rapid ART amongst providers.

## **Wellness Support Services**

**Goal:** Using a HIV status neutral approach, help people address physical, mental, and social well-being to improve health outcomes (PrEP and ART treatment initiation and adherence)

**Intervention:** 3 funded providers providing Movement Practices, Breath Practices, Energy Acupuncture, Bodywork/relaxation, Wellness group sessions.

Started in June 2021

#### Syringe Service Programs (SSP) and Harm Reduction

**Goal**: To increase access to HIV and STI testing, harm reduction materials, wellness products, and linkages to substance use treatment for individuals who may not otherwise engage in services.

**Intervention**: Place three vending machines in conspicuous locations throughout the city, managed by funded providers

Program is in early stages of development

## **PrEP for Housing**

**Goal**: Address housing-related barriers for DC residents who are Gay men of color ages 25-35 to access HIV related care

**Intervention**: Community-based partner provides a renovated housing facility and the office space for a case manager.

PrEP education to program participants

DC Health and Wellness Center: medical and PrEP navigational support.

Program will be launched this month.

New clients are now being identified who are appropriate for this program





- Trusted community-member (non-DC Health staff) as DIS
- At high prevalence site in high burden area
- Started in October 2021



## **Cluster Detection and Response**



Respond

The collection, reporting, and analysis of HIV genetic sequences generated through HIV drug resistance testing for the purposes of interrupting disease transmission and improving health outcomes.



## **Integrated Data Systems**

**Goal**: used to streamline re-engagement and outreach efforts with a goal of decreasing transmission of HIV and improving patient outcomes

**Update**: Successful import of surveillance records into the DC EMA's CAREWare data system
